### **ACHE of Massachusetts Awards David M. Kinzer Scholarships**

She is currently pursuing a Master of Health Administration at Suffolk University in Boston, while working as an information systems electronic medical records coordinator at Tufts Medical Center in Boston.

Seidmon said her participation in ACHE has been valuable in progressively developing her career in healthcare. "The scholarship is meaningful to me because it symbolizes that ACHE really does care about the future of healthcare and helping its student liaisons grow into professionals," she said.
